

From the Desk of Rabbi Peter Rigler



Recently, this picture presented itself to me on our own Church Lane. I had to laugh at seeing so many signs all in one place. I also laughed because it seemed so appropriate for those coming to Temple Sholom for some spiritual direction. We know it is easy to get lost and even easier to get lost when we are confused by our own prayer

book. We want to provide the opportunity to help direct you into the Holy Days this coming year.

For more than 40 years Temple Sholom has used the Gates of Repentance as our *machzor* for the High Holy Days. Just six years ago, our congregation moved to using *Mishkan T'filah* (Dwelling Place of Prayer) as our *siddur* for regular services during the year. *Mishkan T'filah* represented an approach to prayer that was very different from the book that preceded it, but it has become a familiar and welcoming companion to our prayer experience.

Over the past several years a new High Holy Days machzor, similar in approach and style to Mishkan T'filah, has been under development. It is entitled Mishkan Hanefesh (Dwelling Place of the Soul), and after extensive review and consideration we have decided to adopt this new *machzor* for 2015. With a very generous gift from Murray H. Shusterman and Jerry Frank and Melissa Shusterman, we will be able to purchase the new *machzor* for our entire community. We are so grateful for their inspiring gift! So, the 2014 High Holy Days were our last use of Gates of Repentance. Before the official Board vote a few weeks ago, we test piloted a service, made copies available for review, I met with several interested members and the Cantor and I spent a great deal of time reviewing the new *machzor*.

A change such as this means that all of us, clergy and congregants alike, will be learning and adjusting to the new *machzor*. As we look ahead to receiving the new books any day now, we are already at work preparing for the High Holy Day experience. The Cantor and I attended a conference in New York to help us consider how to use the book for our community. I believe the change will be very valuable. The conference opened our eyes to so many exciting possibilities for worship. We are not supposed to come just to feel the comfort of an old book; the changes in readings, poetry and prayer will keep us alert and thinking. That is exactly what I would hope

when we come for the Holy Days. I hope even when we are praying together, you will take the opportunity to get lost in prayer and enjoy the readings. We will make sure to have

copies available in the library when they arrive for review.

We also wanted to establish four learning sessions for exploration of the new book so we could all be better prepared for the Days of Awe.



An introduction to *Mishkan Hanefesh*: Finding our way

Session 1: June 22 at 7:30 p.m. Explore the challenges and opportunities of a new *machzor* with Cantor Marx and Rabbi Rigler.

Session 2: July 13 at 7:30 p.m. We will have the opportunity to hear from the editor of the new *machzor*, Rabbi Edwin Goldberg, a noted lecturer who is senior rabbi at Temple Sholom in Chicago and the former spiritual leader at Temple

Session 3: August 26 at 7:30 p.m. Finding meaning through words and music. An exploration of the pages of our *machzor* and finding the right notes.

Session 4: S'lichot, Saturday, September 5 Melodies of Holiness: opening our hearts to the familiar and the new.

Please take advantage of these sessions and explore our new *machzor* so that when we celebrate our new year it won't be a new book but a new entry point for a *shanah tovah*, a sweet and healthy new year.

Way back in the 16th century, the mystics of Safed were always seeking new ways to experience God's presence.

They were ecstatic worshippers, willing to literally run, leap, and shout for joy just as the psalms tell us to do. Our *kabbalat* Shabbat liturgy comes directly from the practice of these mystics -- the psalms that we sing at the beginning of Friday night services along with texts like *L'cha Dodi* and *Shalom Aleichem*. We know that they would run into the fields on Friday night to welcome Shabbat under the starry sky, out among nature.

We have our own opportunity to pray out in nature on Friday, June 12, for Shabbat in the Park. There is nothing more awe-inspiring than nature. 

assistance, Satell Grant and/or EITC form, as you may be eligible. All financial considerations and discussions are held in complete confidence.





Our antiques appraisal event last month, *What's It Worth?* was a rousing success. Led by Michael Locati of Locati Auctions of Ambler, PA, we found out whether our special items really were valuable or not.



Dr. Merle Horowitz, Retiring Superintendent of Marple Newtown Schools, recently spoke to Hilltoppers members and guests on a topic of which she is an expert: Cyberbullying.

Not only has Dr. Horowitz been the Superintendent for 10 years, she recently won the 2014 Pennsylvania Award for top School Administrators. She has been in education for 40 years and recently appeared on NBC and CBC television, serving on a panel with other top educators.

She has recently gained acclaim for earning her Doctorate, which focused on Cyberbullying. She co-authored a book with internet and technology attorney Dorothy Bollinger entitled Cyberbullying and Social Media in Public School Education. Two copies will soon be available in our Temple Sholom Library. The book sold out immediately and is currently in its second printing.

Dr. Horowitz noted that violence prevention began in the 1980s and 1990s, when it was most commonly On Thursday, June 18th at 5:30 p.m., we will begin our Closing Dinner with a delicious catered Deli Dinner from Mrs. Marty's. Dr. Merle Horowitz Addresses Hilltoppers on Cyberbullying

known as playground bullying. Cyberbullying came about in the turn of the century. She explained that the proliferation of the internet has caused cyberbullying in social media. In 2005, when Dr. Horowitz became Superintendent of Marple Newtown, cyberbullying and texting became very popular – even teacher to teacher. Complaints began being sent to union leadership.

Threatening emails were sent. Parents would write to principals recommending specific teachers be fired. As Dr. Horowitz became aware of these issues, she wrote a magazine article entitled, *The Explosive InBox*. A major book publisher asked her to write a book based on her research and that article.

Cyberbullying can be anonymous and insidious, Dr. Horowitz noted. Victims become depressed, school phobic, experience suicidal ideation. To combat cyberbullying, assemblies in middle schools perform role plays acted by teachers, which are very effective. Afterward, small group discussions take place.

Not only do educators need to talk to children about cyberbullying, but parents must become involved, as well,

Dr. Horowitz urged. Parents need to become more vigilant about their children's behavior. Also, getting the students' doctor involved is a good idea.

Dr. Horowitz noted that even young children are getting destroyed socially and emotionally due to cyberbullying. Reputations can be destroyed.

A new development, sexting, has recently arisen. Photos can be put into DropBox. North Penn High School had an instance of nude and seminude photos of high school girls being posted.

A program has begun to combat this problem in the elementary schools, as well. Teachers are being trained to deal with cyberbullying. Every year, teachers become retrained. Mobile devices are banned these days from locker rooms. Statistically, ¾ of bullying is now cyberbullying.

Upon her retirement this summer, Dr. Horowitz plans to become a consultant on cyberbullying and will also help to train teachers.

For fifty years, Anna Schlemmer has refused to talk about her life in Germany during World War II. Anna's daughter Trudy was only four when she and Anna were liberated from Nazi Weimar by an American soldier and went with him to Minnesota, so Trudy can't remember much...but she has one piece of evidence from the past: a



family portrait showing Trudy, Anna, and a Nazi officer, the Obersturmfuhrer of Buchenwald.

Driven by the guilt of her heritage, Trudy, now a professor of German history, begins investigating the past and finally unearths the dramatic and heartbreaking truth of her mother's life.

Combining a story of passionate but doomed love, a vivid evocation of life during the war, and a poignant mother-daughter drama, New York Times and # 1 international bestseller *Those Who Save Us* is a profound exploration of what we endure to survive and the legacy of shame.

Meeting Recap

Meeting at the home of Arline and Warren Lieberman on April 26, our discussion group numbered about 18 this time. We had a wide ranging conversation about the tension between President Obama and Prime Minister Netanyahu and the state of American-Israeli relations more generally. Our group spans the political spectrum and began with support for one leader or the other and the philosophies and actions they propose. We discussed the way their relationship reflects so many of the larger issues in our politics and in the Middle East.

As the conversation progressed, we found ourselves in increasing agreement that history and domestic politics have mostly aggravated the conflict in the greater Middle East. We agreed that all nations are composed of people with widely varying beliefs. The promotion of person to person contacts and the ensuing decrease in demonization and misunderstanding seems the only long term way to peace. Several members expressed an interest in Temple Sholom acting to promote such contact here and in Israel.
