## ***FROM THE DESK OF RABBI PETER RIGLER***



It is with tremendous gratitude and anticipation that I approach my summer sabbatical beginning June 24<sup>th</sup>. I am grateful to our community for allowing me the ability to take this needed time. The term "sabbatical," which is related to the word Shabbat or time of rest, refers to a leave from normal responsibilities. Its roots come from the Torah, when God instructs Moses on Mount Sinai that the Israelites are to work the fields for six years and on the seventh year the land will have a Shabbat, a complete rest.

This summer marks seven years for me at Temple Sholom and my 14<sup>th</sup> as a Rabbi. I am so excited to have time to just take a deep breath, reflect on my work and build for our future. I know the community will be well cared for under the leadership of Cantor Marx. I am going to disconnect this summer and do not plan on checking email or messages

(wish me luck!). The Cantor and our office are able to handle any and all challenges. We have back up plans in place for the times the Cantor may be away for a few days and we also have pulpit coverage thanks to our Para Clergy.

A Rabbinic sabbatical allows a rabbi to rest, study, and experience new facets of Jewish spirituality and learning. It serves to rejuvenate a rabbi's internal resources for the dual purposes of providing more

knowledge for sermons and synagogue activities and creating an invaluable period of spiritual rejuvenation and professional renewal.

I am excited to share with you my plans for this sabbatical time. Part of my time will be spent traveling to Central America where I will be working with High School students doing community service work in Nicaragua. I also will be spending time at Camp Harlam, participating in a course "Making prayer Real" (you will hear more about that soon), reading, writing, exercising and renewing my own spiritual soul.



On the personal side, I am looking forward to traveling to Canada and Kentucky with my family. We plan on seeing family, friends and exploring a number of parks along the way.

I consider it one of the great blessings of my life that I am a rabbi - a teacher. I know that this time away will allow me to return even stronger and with a

wonderfully renewed sense of purpose. I am so looking forward to using my sabbatical time to reconnect to our traditions and to discover new ideas to bring back home to Temple Sholom.

I am sure you will hear plenty about my time off and I thank you again for that gift!

## **NOTES FROM CANTOR JAMIE MARX**

Philadelphia's Jewish music scene is remarkably understated if you consider the vast musical treasures that we have here. Fabulous musicians, worship leaders, and music educators live and work here, but there aren't a lot of opportunities to hear these talents. One of the few local convenings of Jewish musicians happens in just a few weeks: the Delaware Valley Jewish Choral Festival. Now in its 51<sup>st</sup> year, this program has gotten so successful that they had to start a second concert, one for South Jersey choral groups and one for Philadelphia-based groups.

Our very own Temple Sholom choir will be singing on Sunday, June 5 at 4:00 p.m. The concert will be held at Gratz College

in Melrose Park, in the auditorium. Featuring nine local synagogue and community choirs, they will be performing highlights from throughout the broad repertoire of Jewish music. Not only will each choir perform a few selections, but the choirs join together to sing *Hatikvah*, the Israeli national anthem, and another beloved choral piece. It is truly a revelation to hear hundreds of Jewish singers making beautiful music!

## ***TEMPLE LAY LEADERSHIP: IT'S ABOUT TIME***

As the sun sets on my tenure as President of Temple Sholom, I find myself in awe of how elastic time is. It seems like just yesterday when I assumed the helm from Mike Danowitz, feeling both excited and nervous, hoping I could do the job as well as he did. Now as I look back over the last two years, I can reflect on both the milestones reached and the lessons learned in this important role. And there are many! Yet, what I am left with – and what I believe to be the most important factor of success in lay leadership – is the concept of time.

When people ask me whether being the President of Temple Sholom has been difficult, my answer is always an emphatic “no” with the caveat that it does indeed require a great deal of time. And because time is so important in this role, I wanted to dig a little deeper into this idea and offer some thoughts for future lay leaders at Temple Sholom. Here are five notions are using time to your advantage:

Spend time at Temple Sholom. Your presence at services, programs and events makes all the difference. You can only get the essence of what is happening by being there yourself to experience it all first hand. Showing up puts you in the best position to lead.

Take time to listen to others. You may not always agree with what folks have to say, but everyone deserves a chance to be heard. Our diversity is our strength. The only way we can leverage this strength is to hear from everyone. This philosophy may make for longer meetings and processes, but it is absolutely the right approach.

Buy time when the answer isn't immediately clear. There have been many instances over the last two years when we may not have moved as fast as I (or others) would have liked. Often the reason was because the issue needed time to consider factors such as who will be impacted, how will this affect our budget, or what

precedent does this set? For someone like me who thrives on efficiency, this proved challenging at times. Yet, the best answer always came when extended the process.

Make time to say thank you. This lesson is one I learned from Abbey Krain who always makes it her priority to express gratitude – for big things, for small things, for everything. It is an area that I hope to continue to develop because, to be honest, I don't always make time to share what is in my head and my heart with those who deserved to be thanked. I forget that they don't know how much I appreciate them if I don't tell them. It only takes a few minutes. I need to do more of this at Temple Sholom and out in the world.

Embrace the time you have. I haven't regretted a minute of my Presidency. The opportunity to serve as a lay leader for what I consider to be the most amazing synagogue on the planet is one that I have truly cherished. I wouldn't have taken the job if I didn't feel I could contribute in a way that created joy for me, my family and my congregation. To future lay leaders who are considering stepping up, please do! Not out of obligation, but because you want to serve. Say yes to the job, and mean it.

I have been so very blessed to have the opportunity to be Temple Sholom's President. Working with Rabbi Rigler, Cantor Marx, Abbey, Lori, Brooke, Marissa and the lay leadership has been incredibly rewarding and life changing for me. We are extremely lucky that my able successor, Mary Ann Gould, also understands the value of time, demonstrated by her presence and commitment to our congregation for many years. We are in very good hands. And I am so grateful for the time we have had together.

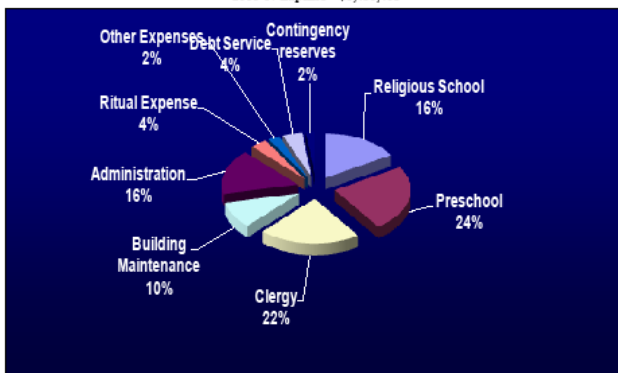

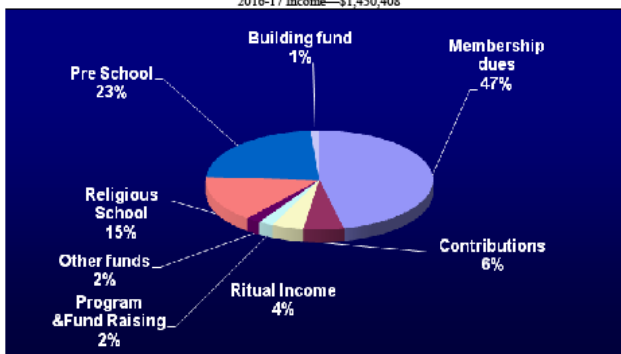
### YOUR MEMBERSHIP CONTRIBUTIONS MAKE A DIFFERENCE

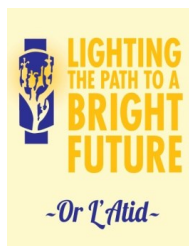

### *The Greatest Influence on My Jewish Journey* by Cassie Rosin

From my first time experiencing Hanukkah, to my Bat Mitzvah and confirmation, and continuing to today, my Jewish experience has been greatly impacted by music.

When I was very young, my father's side of the family introduced me to Hanukkah. For us, since I was too little to understand, Hanukkah meant we lit the candles, listened to my dad sing these prayers in a language I did not know, and then opened presents. We didn't focus on the story or how it affected the Jewish people. It was very simple. Then, I learned the prayers in order to sing along. Even though I didn't quite understand, the tradition meant a lot to me.

Fast forward to spring of third grade. My parents asked me and my sister if we would like to join a synagogue. I jumped at the opportunity and was enrolled in Temple Sholom's Sunday and Hebrew schools for the next fall. In my first weeks I was introduced to Kol Shalom, the children's choir led by Cantor Patty [Kaplan]. I learned about Judaism through those songs. "Tree of Life" taught me about how important the Torah was to the Jewish people, "Wherever You Go" taught me that I was never alone in my beliefs, and "Oseh Shalom" taught me that the world needs love and peace to survive. As I learned, I became even more involved.

My seventh grade year brought my Bat Mitzvah. I was told that each student led the service on their special day, and although I was nervous, I was excited. Chanting Torah was hard. My passage was obscure and it was a lot to remember. Fortunately, Cantor Patty



assisted me through all of it. Then, I learned that after my Bat Mitzvah Cantor Patty was leaving Temple Sholom. It crushed me. She had taught me most of what I knew about Judaism. I decided I was going to try even harder in order to be an impressive final B'nei Mitzvah. During the service I messed up my Haftorah, but every time I looked over, she was smiling at me. I knew all of the prayers, and by the time she called me over near the end of the service, I was feeling pretty good. "L'Chi Lach" was the song she sang to me. I will never forget that song for as long as I live. That song brought me to shameless tears, and it still does today. "And you shall be a blessing, L'Chi Lach."

In this year before my graduation, I have been a proud member of the song leaders during Sunday school. I have been given the chance to teach the next generation what I know. Over the year, the song leaders have taught songs about everything from dreidels made of cupcakes to the holiness of the sanctuary. Seeing those children get involved in the religion brings back so many memories from my years of religious school.

I now can say for sure that as I graduate, the generations to come will make more beautiful music, and each song will be another reason that I am proudly Jewish.

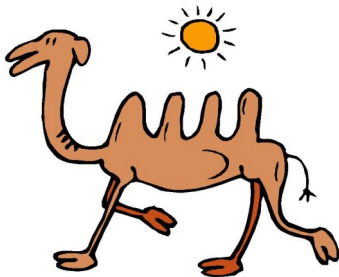

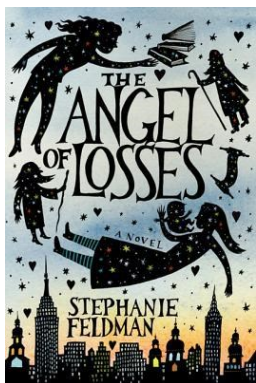

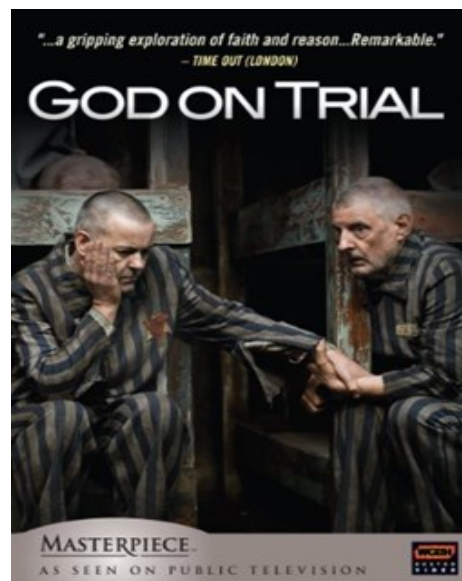
