FROM THE DESK OF RABBI PETER RIGLER



What does Judaism have to teach us about life? Even more challenging what does Judaism have to teach us about modern life? How can an ancient tradition address today's needs and challenges? Judaism is as relevant

today as it was thousands of years ago because it is forever adapting and changing to help us understand who we are and our place in the world. On January 27th at 7:00 p.m., we will have the opportunity to hear from an amazing scholar and person, Dr. Paul Wolpe, who will be speaking on the topic of: *If I am Only My Genes, What Am I? Jewish Identity and the Genetic Self*. The Genetic Age is coming, and with it confusion about the nature of our bodies, our biology, and our sense of selfhood. The Jews have a unique contribution to make to this debate, for we have long been exploring the issues of identity and self that genes make so problematic.

If you work in the medical profession in any capacity we are inviting you to join us for a special reception at 6:00 p.m., please call the office for more information.

Paul is a gifted speaker and has a great deal to teach us! Paul Wolpe is the director of the Center for Ethics at Emory, the Asa Griggs Candler Professor of Bioethics, the Raymond F. Schinazi Distinguished Research Chair in Jewish Bioethics, and a professor in the departments of medicine, pediatrics and sociology. He also serves as the first bioethicist for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, where he formulates policy on bioethical issues and safeguarding research subjects.

His teaching and publications range across multiple fields of bioethics and sociology, including death and dying, genetics and eugenics, sexuality and gender, mental health and illness, alternative medicine, and bioethics in extreme environments such as space.

A WORD FROM THE BOARD: EMBARKING ON OUR STRATEGIC PLANNING JOURNEY

Judaism has long embraced the metaphor of “the journey.” Both our ancient and contemporary histories recount numerous stories of great travels: from Abraham through Moses and Sarah through Ruth, from the destruction of the Second Temple through the founding of Israel, we are reminded that we are, after all, a journeying people.

We come to understand who we are and our place in the world through a quest of inward and outward exploration. And so the “journey of self-discovery” is an apt description for Temple Sholom’s 2018 expedition into a strategic planning process. Our organizational discovery will surely inspire our strategic plan since knowing our organization’s distinct assets and thinking about our future will prepare us well to make informed choices and map our path forward.

As a new member of the Board of Trustees, I am delighted to work with the Board, clergy and lay leaders to guide the congregation through a year-long strategic planning process of discovery and assessment, goal setting and planning. Together we will dream about where - and how - we would like our journey to go. Early in 2018 we will take our first steps on this path with a two-pronged exploration phase: (1) a series of informal listening sessions and (2) a coordinated data collection process.

Listening Sessions: Beginning in mid-February, members of the Temple Board will open their homes to host small gatherings of congregants to allow us to hear different perspectives on the Temple’s future. More

details on these events will be forthcoming, and we hope that as many people as possible will plan to participate.

Data Collection and Analysis: Temple Sholom has been selected to participate in the URJ Benchmarking and Assessment Project, giving us a rare opportunity to not only learn about ourselves but put those learnings into the context of other synagogues. Three data-collection activities will take place during early 2018 and will accelerate our process of self-discovery (a Congregational Survey, a Financial and Operating Data Benchmarking Tool, and a Board Self-Assessment Reflection). For this work to be most meaningful, we need 100% participation in the Congregational Survey running from January 29th until February 20th. You will hear more about the survey in the coming weeks.

Anyone who has ever participated in an effective strategic planning process knows that the true value of the plan lies not in the final report, but in the journey itself. Full participation, transparency, enthusiasm and commitment are the essential items to pack in our travel bags to make this experience memorable, fulfilling, and productive.

I look forward to traveling with you throughout the coming year.

INCLUSION AND SPECIAL NEEDS NEWS

Temple Sholom in Broomall was recently recognized by the Union for Reform Judaism ("URJ") as a *URJ Disabilities Inclusion Exemplar Congregation*! This means that our community meets the high standards established by URJ for being an inclusive congregation that provides a number of accommodations for its members and guests so that people of all abilities can fully participate. This also means that Temple Sholom will be listed on the URJ's website as an *Exemplar Congregation*, and that folks seeking a community that is inclusive can find us. The Temple Sholom delegation at the URJ Biennial in Boston this past December were honored by URJ President Rabbi Rick Jacobs.

The Inclusion Committee has planned a wonderful JDAIM (Jewish Disabilities Awareness and Inclusion Month) celebration with a Shabbat Service on February 23rd. This celebration is an opportunity to inform our community of the many wonderful accommodations Temple Sholom offers, as well as to help all congregants understand and appreciate the importance of respecting those accommodations, assuring that our members and guests experience accessibility when they come to services or a program event.

Accessibility and Inclusion are not the "job" of the Inclusion Committee. Rather, it is the responsibility and moral values that we all share enabling persons with differences or challenges to bless our congregation by participating fully. We will be welcoming Sara Crimm, Executive Director of Families CCAN, as our guest speaker. She will tell us about this grassroots organization that provides support to families with adult children who have special needs. Visual Tefillah will be in use to assist those guests with a hearing impairment, but can also enrich everyone's Shabbat experience.

Other JDAIM activities include a program about visual impairment for our young *Rimon* students on February 4th - presenters are Cheryl and Bill Gross. Jack Kedson (a high school senior) and Andrew Danowitz (a high school junior) recently did a presentation for the older *Rimon* students, in grades 6 - 10, on November 27th. These fine young men have been trained in the *TAP* (Teen Assistance Program) program sponsored by Jewish Learning Venture, and work as assistants in our *Rimon* School. Their goals include assisting students who may have a learning difference or other challenge, and with this support, our TS children can feel included in the congregation's religious school. Jack and Andrew did a terrific presentation about the importance of inclusion in the school setting, and how such support benefits everyone. We are so proud of these young men, and suspect that they may have inspired a few of our younger students to become *TAP* volunteers.

During Shabbat Services on March 23, Visual Tefillah will be available. Many thanks to our clergy for their hard work and tech savvy to incorporate Visual Tefillah in our services. We welcome your feedback about this as we strive to improve the experience of Visual Tefillah. The Inclusion Committee has other projects in the works to improve the quality of our programs and services for people with a hearing impairment. There are also many other accommodations available for people with a mobility or visual challenge. SANCTUARY MINHAG (CUSTOMS) AT TEMPLE SHOLOM

At Temple Sholom, we observe the following customs (*minhag*) regarding entering the sanctuary during services:

People are not permitted to enter the sanctuary when:

- ***the congregation is standing***
- ***the ark is open***
- ***the Rabbi is speaking***
- ***the choir is standing up and singing***
- ***or at times that would be disrespectful – at the discretion of the sanctuary usher.***

It is recommended that children under 12 years of age attend Family Services which are held for those families with children younger than 12 years old and who wish to come as a family. We ask that parents be responsible for the behavior of their children.

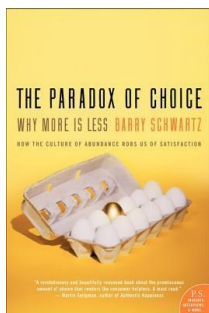

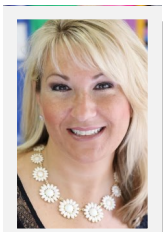

RIMON: WHAT INSPIRES ME



There are so many people who inspire me in the work that I do as a Jewish educator. One of those people is Rabbi Jonathan Sacks, former Chief Rabbi of the United Hebrew Congregations in the UK. Rabbi Sacks is a passionate champion of Jewish education as is exemplified in his December 2017 speech to the House of Lords on Education.

The World our Children Will Inherit Tomorrow is Born in the Schools We Build Today

“At the dawn of our people’s history, Moses assembled the Israelites on the brink of the Exodus. He didn’t talk about the long walk to freedom. He didn’t speak about the land flowing with milk and honey. Instead, repeatedly, he turned to the far horizon of the future and spoke about the duty of parents to educate their children. He did it again at the end of his life, commanding: “You shall teach these things repeatedly to your children, speaking of them when you sit in your house, when you walk on the way, when you lie down and when you rise up.

Why this obsession with education that has stayed with us from that day to this? Because to defend a country you need an army. But to defend a civilization you need schools. You need education as the conversation between the generations.

Whatever the society, the culture or the faith, we need to teach our children, and they theirs, what we aspire to and the ideals we were bequeathed by those who came before us. We need to teach our children the story of which we and they are a part, and we need to trust them to go further than we did, when they come to write their own chapter.

We make a grave mistake if we think of education only in terms of knowledge and skills – what the American writer David Brooks calls the resume virtues as opposed to the eulogy virtues.

And this is not wooly idealism. It’s hard-headed pragmatism. Never has the world changed so fast, and it’s getting faster each year. We have no idea what patterns of employment will look like in 2, let alone 20 years from now, what skills will be valued,



and which done instead by artificially intelligent, preternaturally polite robots.

We need to give our children an internalized moral Satellite Navigation System so that they can find their way across the undiscovered country called the future. We need to give them the strongest possible sense of collective responsibility for the common good, because we don’t know who will be the winners and losers in the lottery of the global economy and we need to ensure its blessings are shared. There is too much “I” and too little “We” in our culture and we need to teach our children to care for others, especially those not like us.

We work for all these things in our Jewish schools. We give our children confidence in who they are, so that they can handle change without fear and keep learning through a lifetime. We teach them not just to be proud Jews, but proud to be defenders of democratic freedom and active citizens helping those in need.

Schools are about more than what we know and what we do. They are about who we are and what we must do to help others become what they might be. The world our children will inherit tomorrow is born in the schools we build today.”
